

## OUR 2024 - A YEAR END MESSAGE FROM LOURDES

As we approach the close of another year, I want to take a moment to reflect on our shared accomplishments, growth, and the incredible journey that lies ahead for International Funders for Indigenous Peoples (IFIP).

This year, we have seen tremendous progress in advancing our mission dedicated to amplifying Indigenous self-determination and leadership. Our partnerships with you our members and allies have been at the heart of our mission this year. By collaborating on a range of events – both online and in person—we have created opportunities to amplify Indigenous voices, share their perspectives and promote meaningful dialogue. These events have deepened understanding, inspired action, and strengthened connections across the philanthropic community and Indigenous Peoples.

We launched two groundbreaking reports that have furthered our understanding of the funding landscape for Indigenous Peoples. Leaders and Stewards: Global Analysis of Funding to Indigenous Women highlighted the urgent need for increased investment in Indigenous women-led initiatives, emphasizing their critical role as stewards of their communities and territories. Similarly, the Funding Trend Analysis on Indigenous Peoples Philanthropy revealed persistent gaps in direct funding to Indigenous organizations and provided actionable recommendations to foster equity, collaboration, and direct resource allocation. These reports are not just milestones—they are blueprints for shaping a more just and inclusive philanthropic ecosystem, and we encourage you to read these reports, share them within your networks and implement the recommendations in the work you are doing with Indigenous Peoples.

### **Key Findings**



# Only 0.6% of all giving went to organisations benefiting Indigenous Peoples

Over the 5 years of this study, the value of grants for Indigenous Peoples was \$4.5 billion across 32,516 grants. From this value, grants to Indigenous Peoples Organizations (including Indigenous Governments and Autonomous Regions and Indigenous Peoples Organizations) were \$1.5 billion across 11,301 grants, and Non-Indigenous Organizations received \$3.0 billion across 21,215 grants.




From 2016-2020 about 28.5 billion was given in grants supporting women and girls however, looking specifically at Indigenous women only 1.4% was given to organisations benefiting Indigenous women.

### Indigenous Women need Flexible Funding

Indigenous Women's organizations need flexible long-term funding that is not tied to specific projects. This would allow them to plan initiatives with greater impact, such as the protection of their territories or the economic empowerment of their communities.

42% of Indigenous Women's organizations reported receiving grants between \$25K and \$50K
